

So you want to learn to ride?...

Several of our members inquired at the last two meetings about riding classes for beginners. Well, we heard you! Below are the dates through June 2008 that the "Basic Rider Course" is being offered here in Columbia:

31 – June 1

April 26 – 27 June 7 - 8

May 3 – 4 June 21 - 22

May 24 – 25 June 28 – 29

Classes are Saturdays and Sundays from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Classroom instruction is held at Harley-Davidson of Columbia with the riding portion taking place on the course behind Cox Middle School. Classes are limited to 12 students.

<u>Basic Rider Course</u> - \$205 -This course is your "learn to ride" course and/or the course that would serve as a refresher for those of you who haven't ridden in quite awhile. We furnish all the motorcycles and helmets for those of you who don't have one.

...You already know how to ride but you want more?..

For those of you that don't need the "basics" but would like to advance your skills, consider the "Experienced Rider Course".**

<u>Experienced Rider Course</u> - \$99 - This course is the "next course" in your motorcycle training experience. You take this course on your own motorcycle and practice advanced turning and braking. This course prepares you for real world riding situations and familiarizes you with the handling of your motorcycle.

If we can get 12 Muletown Members to sign up to take the "ERC" on the same day, they will drop the price to \$75.00 per person (instead of \$99.00). (Please note: At this point in time, the "ERC" is not offered in Columbia. Those that enroll in the "ERC" will have to take it in Murfreesboro or Nashville.)

Also Available:

<u>Women Only Motorcycle Classes - \$205</u> - Classes designed for women who have never ridden, who feel they may need a little more individual attention, and to provide an non-intimidating environment for women to learn to ride together.

<u>Private Classes</u>: Private classes are available for those who need classes offered not on weekends or who wish to have one-on-one instruction. You name any two days you would like to have class and we will work to accommodate your requests. Private classes cost \$400

DOES YOUR MOTORCYCLE "FIT" YOU?

I have been reading lately about how to choose a motorcycle and they say that there are three criteria for choosing your ride. They are function, fit, and style.

The first of these is how you are going to use your motorcycle. Is it going to be just for around town runs, day trips or road trips with overnighters. Most people that love a particular model can make it serve as a road bike if the need arises with some sort of saddlebags, windshield and other accessories.

The third criteria is style and as we all know, the choices for how your bike looks are virtually endless. You can personalize your bike however you want to plus it gives you a sense of pride in ownership. With just a little art work or a piece of chrome your bike becomes really yours and takes on its own personality.

However, that second criteria which they call fit is probably the most important of all three in making your bike both a pleasure to ride as well as safer and more easy to handle. Items that you must pay particular attention to include handlebars, seat, saddle height, grips, foot controls, road pegs. I know from experience what a difference some of these things make for the rider. When I bought my current motorcycle, I rode it for a while and then made the adjustments. I had it lowered, changed the handle bars, adjusted the road pegs and what a difference that made. Changing the bend of the elbows and the position of the back was amazing.

So, if your bike just doesn't feel right sometimes, think about the adjustments you might try to improve the "fit". You can read more about customizing your Harley on the HD website:

Engine and Exhaust Modifications: A Thing of the Past?

Ever heard of CARB? Well, if not, meet the California Air Resources Board. I know, we live in Tennessee, a long way from California, so what's it to us? A recent \$1,000,000.00 settlement between CARB and Dynojet Research, Inc. could have arms longer that those of your local law enforcement agency. Dynojet Research is the maker of the popular "Power Commander" used by many to change the air/fuel mixture and timing of their motorcycles and work in concert with a set of aftermarket pipes to improve horsepower and torque. Dynojet also agreed to develop a CARB-certified Power Commander that many experts feel will be next to useless.

The CARB action only impacts Dynojet at this time but many are willing to bet that others will soon feel the scrutiny of CARB. Dynojet certainly isn't the only manufacturer of devices intended to enhance engine performance. Likewise, how long is it going to be before CARB turns its attention to makers of aftermarket exhaust systems?

So you ask again, what does that mean to us in Tennessee. Maybe nothing at the moment. However, so much of what happens in California, eventually fines its way to other states. It may only be a matter of time before our legislators or state environmental agency begins looking more closely at motorcycle engine and exhaust modifications. If that happens your ability to modify your bike's engine may become a thing of the past.
