Asst. Director's Report

Do You Know Tennessee's Motorcycle Laws?

So you think you know all there is to know about Tennessee's motorcycle laws, well here is a little test of your knowledge. The answers are provided at the end of the article. Don't cheat by looking forward.

- 1. True or False: Tennessee recognizes motorcycle license endorsements from other states.
- 2. True or False: Tennessee requires that all motorcycles operated on public roads be equipped with a headlight and that the headlight be used during daylight hours. However, headlight modulators are not legal in Tennessee.
- 3. True or False: Protective eye wear, goggles or eye wear with safety glass are always required for those riding motorcycles.
- 4. True or False: Tennessee has strict regulations regarding the height of a motorcycle's handlebars.
- 5. True or False: Tennessee code does not address the practice of "lane splitting".
- 6. True or False: Tennessee code is silent concerning maximum sound levels for a

motorcycle.

- 7. True or False: Tennessee code requires both left and right side mirrors for motorcycles ridden on public roads
- 8. True or False: Riding motorcycles two abreast in the same lane is a legal riding practice in Tennessee.
- 9. True or False: Tennessee has an age restriction regarding passengers on a motorcycle.
- 10. True or False: When unrecognized at a red light a motorcyclist may proceed through the red light with due caution after a full stop.
- 11. True or False: Turn signals are required on all motorcycles ridden on public roads.

Here are your answers.

- 1. True: Other states motorcycle endorsements are recognized in Tennessee
- 2. False: The use of headlights during daylight hours is required, however, the use of headlight modulators is allowed by federal regulation. Tennessee law does not address headlight modulators.
- 3. False: Protective eye wear is not required if the motorcycle is equipped with a windscreen. Would you ride without protective eye wear? Not me!
- 4. False: Tennessee code does not restrict the height of handlebars.
- 5. False: Lane splitting is explicitly prohibited by state code.
- 6. True: Tennessee code does not address motorcycle maximum sound levels; it does, however, state that all motorcycles ridden on public roads must have a muffler.
- 7. False: Motorcycles ridden on public roads must have either a left side or right side mirror but are not required to have both.
- 8. True: It may not be a smart idea but riding two abreast in the same lane is a legal practice in Tennessee.
- 9. False: There are no age restrictions for passengers.
- 10. True: When unrecognized at a red light you may proceed with due caution after a full stop.
- 11. False: Turn signals are not required.

How did you do? My sources of information were the American Motorcycle Association and Tennessee Code Annotated.

Our chapter picnic has come and gone. Turned out to be a great day and good times were had by all.


Thanks to all who were able to come on out and especially for the participation in our "silly" games.



70's Famous Guitarists


