Head Road Captain's Report

Welcome to another riding season with the Muletown Hog Chapter.

Our goal is to have as good or better planned rides as we have had all the previous years. With the success of last year's rides this will be a feat. If you have a favorite destination you would like to share with the chapter let a Road Captain or Officer know and we will do our best to plan the ride. If this is going to be your first ride with the chapter and you're wondering how we keep everyone together, here's a section from our Muletown Chapter Group Riding Handbook that helps explain it.

No Rider Left Behind Section.

When the "lead group" is unable to safely slow down to allow the "split group" to catch up, the last rider of the "lead group" will stop at each turn along the way as a "marker" for the "split group." They will join the split group as they pass until they catch up with the "lead group." In any case "split groups" should continue on until the rest planned stop or destination.

So if you notice you're the last bike in the lead group and the bikes in front of you turn, you should safely pull over to the side of the road and wait for the bikes behind you to catch up. If the group in front of you turns again before you catch them someone will be waiting at that turn to show you the way. It's the goal of the Road Captains to have everyone arrive at the final destination safely and together, and no one worrying about being left behind.

Leathers Really Are Worth The Price

20+ times more effective than your jeans

And, with the colder weather the odds are that many of you have begun wearing leather chaps and heavier jackets. Though pretty expensive, there's ample proof that these provide far more than protection from the cold.

In studies of 'survivability' of various garment materials to a 50 MPH ride on asphalt, for example, denim lasted no more than FOUR FEET before wearing through. Kevlar, on the other hand, lasted EIGHTEEN FEET. But standard motorcycle quality (about three times heavier than fashion jacket material) lasted EIGHTY-SIX FEET. That's more than 20 times as effective as your jeans in protecting your hide.
